The failure to recognise and fairly compensate for these forms of work leads to a failure to recognise the central role of care work in our societies. This often leads to continued economic disadvantage throughout work life to retirement and renders the caretakers vulnerable with lesser possibility to enforce their labour rights. Caregivers can be in full-time or part-time employment, students, elderly, single mothers and in ever changing situations. Our social support systems and labour cannot continue failing at providing financial security and legal standing for all if we wish to eradicate poverty from our world.
