2	EELV	5-8	replace	The European Green Party continues to regret the decision of British voters (by a small majority) to leave the EU. We believe that this decision will have profound negative consequences on the populations of England, Wales, Scotland, Ireland, and Gibraltar, including the potential impacts of negative consequences an EU/non-EU border in the latter two cases.	While respecting the decision of the British voters (by a small majority) to leave the EU resulting from the referendum, the European Green Party continues to regret it. We believe that this decision will have profound negative consequences on the populations of England, Wales, Scotland, Ireland, and Gibraltar, including the potential impacts of negative consequences an EU/non-EU border in the latter two cases.	Lately, votes in the EU have not always been respected, thus it is important that the EGP states first that the vote is to be respected.
3	EELV	30-31	replace	The UK population must be able to make an informed decision between two possible futures: Brexit as defined by the exit negotiations, or continued membership of the EU.	At the end of the negotiations and before the UK withdrawal from the EU become legally effective, the UK citizens must be able to democratically express their view on the proposed deal.	The current text denies the validity of the Brexit vote. Although there is much to say about the conditions of the propaganda, and of the vote itself, it is the democratic expression of the British population's will to leave the EU, and thus "not continue membership of the EU".
