Customs examines these species against those arriving from countries outside the EU. But once the products have entered the EU, or come from within the EU, no strict control takes place. They can only call the police, but they cannot detain the person, and no statistics are kept, which makes it very difficult to know how widespread the problem is. This is due to the protection of the free trade in the EU, and CITES species are not listed as an exception as control may still take place. We demand that trade with CITES listed species should make an exception from this, just as weapons and drugs. The trade with exotic animals should be regulated through a positive list instead of a negative list."</p>
