Any person who has, or is, under any form of gender-based violence has to have at their disposal resources to structurally run away from their situation, to be protected and to develop a free life project, including with their descendants and/or dependent relatives. The policies against gender-based violence must include also a perspective ensuring the best interests of the child when relevant.
